DEER HARVEST REPORTING INSTRUCTIONS & LOG

<u>All</u> hunters, regardless of age or license requirement,* must log (Step 1) their harvested deer prior to moving it from the point where found and report (Step 2) the harvest within 24 hours.** These steps can be completed using one of the following options:

Option A – Log and Report (Steps 1 and 2) on your mobile device with the **FWC Fish|Hunt Florida Mobile App** or by logging into your customer account at **GoOutdoorsFlorida.com**. Instructions for reporting harvest online and downloading and using the app can be found at **MyFWC.com/HarvestReport**.

Option B – Paper Deer Harvest Log and Follow-Up Reporting – Hunters can log (Step 1) on a paper deer harvest log (below) and then report (Step 2) by:

- Reporting at GoOutdoorsFlorida.com or Fish|Hunt Florida Mobile App
- Calling 888-HUNT-FLORIDA (888-486-8356)

Confirmation Number Requirements – The deer harvest reporting process is not complete until the harvest is successfully submitted, and a confirmation number is given. The confirmation number will be provided in an email (if a valid email address is on file) and will be saved in the Harvest Report History section of the customer profile on the **Fish|Hunt Florida Mobile App** and at **GoOutdoorsFlorida.com**.

- * Hunters exempt from license requirements who do not have an FWC customer ID number (CID) can obtain one by going to GoOutdoorsFlorida.com and clicking on "Create Customer Account."
- ** Hunters must report (Step 2) the harvested deer: 1) within 24 hours of harvest, or 2) prior to final processing of the deer, or 3) prior to the deer or any parts of the deer being transferred to a meat processor or taxidermist, or 4) prior to the deer leaving the state, whichever occurs first.

Helpful Tip! Keep this paper deer harvest log or mobile device with you to avoid delays in moving harvested deer.

Deer harvested on licensed game farms/hunting preserves or those possessed that were killed by motor vehicles do not have to be reported.
